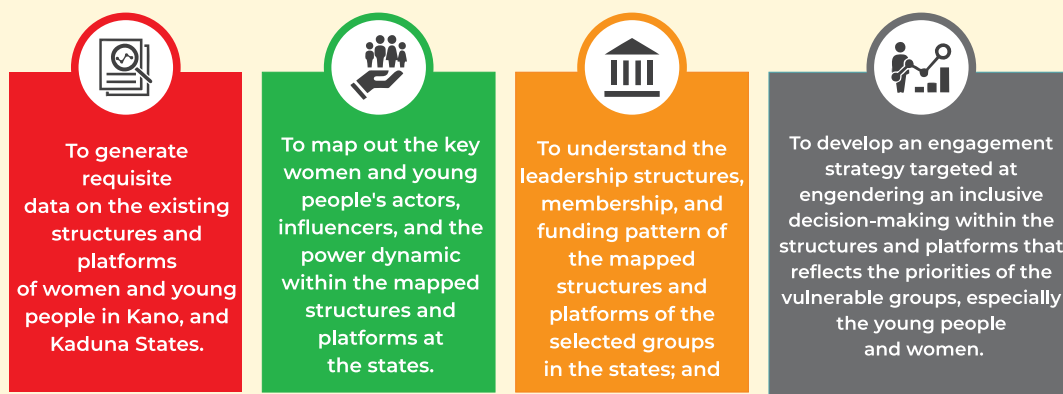

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

**K**aduna and Kano States have a vibrant youth and women population. Although they account for more than 50% of registered voters in the states, this does not reflect in the state Houses of Assembly, local councils, and the Federal level. While there are opportunities to build the capacity of youths and women towards increased participation in the political and elective space, understanding how these groups are organized into platforms and movement, would provide useful information on how to work with them. As such, this report presents a mapping and assessment of women and young people's movement and platforms in Kaduna and Kano. The specific objectives are:



Funded by Campaigns for Inclusion of Women and Young People in Political and Governance Processes (We-You Pro) and facilitated by ActionAid Nigeria, questionnaire, and key informant interview (KII) instrument were administered to targeted groups in the states using Google forms. The research found that:

### Existing structures and platforms of women and young people in the states

- 77% (51 out of 66) of the movements/platforms in Kaduna State are registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) while the 62% (16 out of 26) are registered with the CAC in Kano State. On the other hand, 23% of the youths and women movements/platforms are registered within the Local Government Areas they operate in Kaduna State, while 38% are registered within the Local Government Areas in Kano State.
- Membership of these movements and platforms in specific Local Government Area range from 10 to 5,000 in Kano State, and from 4 to 8500 in Kaduna State. By sectoral classification, 87% of the movements were classified as social in Kaduna and 95% in Kano State.



## **Mapping of actors, influencers, and the power dynamic within the mapped structures and platforms at the states**

- The leadership recruitment process for these platforms and movements is dominantly through appointment and closely followed by election within the movements/platforms. . Whereas there is an effective process of transiting the leadership from the founder of the movements/platforms to a state lead in Kaduna, it is more common to find movements/platforms that still have their leadership retained by the founder.
- Transition from one administration to the other within these movements/platforms is tenured, usually 4 years and renewable. Key actors and influencers within these movements and platforms are persons in government, the academia and or have gained prominence in the public policy space. The use of social to communicate findings to the targeted groups should be accompanied with the use of traditional media such as radio and communication through traditional leaders as well.
- Leadership structures, membership, and funding pattern of the mapped structures and platforms of the selected groups in the states
- Most of the movements and platforms are registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) or registered in the Local Government Areas where they operate.
- Membership is usually by having a common base either as members of the same interest group, religious affiliation, or ideology. Others operate membership by registration. Funding is also largely through donations and support from a partner's organizations usually to implement programmes/ projects.
- In both states, the major source of funding for these movements and platforms are through membership fees/contributions

## **Analysis of the identified structures of Youth and Women Movement and platforms in Kaduna and Kano States shows that:**

- Young people and women are organized into movements and platforms. Engaging them using these platforms can help scale up their inclusion in the governance space.
- More of these platforms are registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission. This is crucial as it communicates that they are compliant with the requirement for legal registration. Whereas a hand full are registered at the local governments where they operate, they have a wide reach at this level and can sensitize a critical mass of young people and women groups to participate in the political space.



- While the We You Project can partner with these CAC registered platforms and movements, it is important to ask them to also partner with others at the grassroots level.
- Funding of the movements and platforms at the Local Government Areas that have been chosen by the project, should be done using those that are registered with the CAC.
- Lastly, whereas these groups have persons they label as influential – those who help them to get government to listen or propagate their advocacy, translating messages into local language and identifying radio stations and traditional media remains critical for mobilization at the Local Government Areas.

## SECTION ONE:

## BACKGROUND

### 1.1 Introduction

It has been almost 22 years of democratic experience since Nigeria returned to democratic governance in 1999. A mapping of women and young people's movement and platforms in key states, would provide an avenue to understand how youths and women are organized in movements and platforms.

Women and youths play a vital role in the nation's civic and political space. How youths and women are organized in these spaces also determines their resilience, support system and helps to examine their participation in the development and governance space in their states. Although efforts are being made to conduct a population census in 2022, the absence of a national database on the political economy of youths and women movements leaves more questions unanswered.

Some of the questions to be addressed in this study are what is the structure of these platforms? How many are they, how inclusive are they along gender lines and persons with disabilities? What is their spread in the states, do they have records of working with the state and Non-State actors towards attaining set development goals? Who are the key people in these groups (women, men, young people, State, and Non-State actors)? What are their goals and what legal mediums have they used to influence government policies and programmes? What are the power dynamics within these movements and platforms, and how do they interact with those of the wider society (domestic and external)?

Kaduna and Kano States are two of the biggest economies in Northern Nigeria. The population of these states also offers them huge human resource potential that can be harnessed to drive their economies. These combinations of economic and socio-demographic potentials places the young people, women, and girls of these states in a position to take advantage of the vast opportunities that exist in economic, social, technological, environmental, and business space. This is especially important as these states, despite their potentials, have some of the highest unemployment and poverty rates in the country, and has continued to record Internally Generated Revenue (IGR), way below their potentials.

The impact of the COVID-19 on the Nigerian economy also calls for an examination of how these movements and platforms were impacted by the pandemic and how they helped to sustain the livelihoods of their members as well as the wider community. How these groups help to promote civic responsibilities such as voters' registration, end to Sexual and Gender-based Violence, Child's rights, among others, would also be vital. Targeting women and youths with government programmes and interventions would also be more efficient if there was a study that mapped women and youth groups in Nigeria.

## 1.2. Objectives

The broad objective of this study is to conduct a mapping and assessment of women and young people's movement and platforms in Kaduna and Kano States that would be mobilized and engaged to lead on Campaigns for Inclusion of Women and Young People in Political and Governance Processes (We-YOU Pro) Project in the states.

The specific objectives are:

- i. To generate requisite data on the existing structures and platforms of women and young people in Kano, and Kaduna States.
- ii. To map out the key women and young people's actors, influencers, and the power dynamic within the mapped structures and platforms at the states.
- iii. To understand the leadership structures, membership, and funding pattern of the mapped structures and platforms of the selected groups in the states; and
- iv. To develop an engagement strategy targeted at engendering an inclusive decision-making within the structures and platforms that reflect the priorities of the vulnerable groups, especially the young people and women.

## 1.3. Methodology

Desk review of studies on women and youth movements and platforms in Kaduna and Kano States was conducted. Questionnaire was also designed and translated into Google forms. The aim of the questionnaire was to collect data on Women and Youth groups as well as to collect general data on the structure and operations of such groups. The survey instrument also allowed for the identified movements and platforms to document their responses with respect to their structure, actors, influencers, and power dynamic.

## 1.4 Working Definition of Movements/ Platforms

Studies<sup>1</sup> have identified the following characteristics of movements:

- They are organized and centered on an idea to bring about conscious change or to resist societal change.
- They are a feature of modern societies,
- They emerge out of generational tensions and relations and are rooted in specific socio-historical conditions.





Movements are organized around several motivations including student rebellions, cultural innovations (literary, artistic, music), scientific revolutions, religious reforms, ethnic revolts, nationalist, and political generations, and environmental, peace, and antiwar movements. In the past, most movements for youths and women could be led by just anyone or a group of persons, but with a focus on young people or females. Recent experience with movements and platforms focused on women and youths shows that, women movement are about women and youth platforms are about young people.

The evolution of movements has been associated with two sources: (a) intergenerational conflict, and (b) intra-generational conflict among competing generation units or mobilized youth/women groups. The starting point for movements/platforms formed from the standpoint of inter-generational conflict is that they involve women or young people's dissatisfaction with the status quo and the authorization of their contemporaries to come together and organize for social and political change. On the other hand, groups that are motivated from the standpoint of intergenerational conflict are usually revolutionary and reactionary. Although they could aim to be progressive, moderate, or even conservative, their platforms are usually associated with trade and labour unions that protest for social change using strikes and other industrial actions.

The types of movements studied in this report are those with origin around intergenerational conflict. These groups (whether with youth or women focus) are composed of a group of persons that are dissatisfied with the status quo and have organized themselves through registration with federal laws to seek enhanced social conditions for the benefit of all. The youth and women's movements/platforms examined in this study are therefore those that have a focus on social issues. Platforms/movements are generally arranged around social, political, and economic reasons. The focus in this report is on those around social reasons. Because enhancing the probability of achieving better outcomes would involve active participation and engagement in the civic and elective space, the premise for this report is that social established structures within existing legal frameworks, with a clear and transparent process of having membership, funding, and leadership succession, would benefit from support to partner and engage with existing structures for social change.



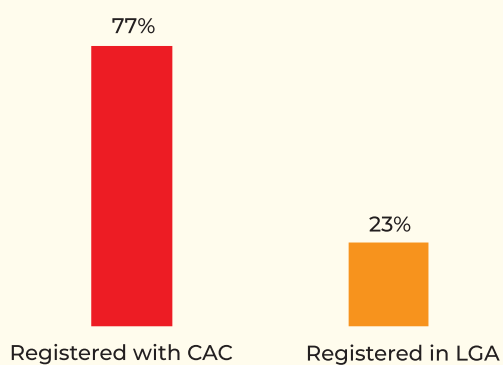
## SECTION TWO:

### ANALYSIS OF THE DATA ON THE EXISTING STRUCTURES AND PLATFORMS OF WOMEN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN KANO AND KADUNA STATES

The report relies on primary data collected from Kaduna and Kano States. Questionnaires were administered using Google forms to youth and women movements/platforms as well as the public. The report identified a total of 26 youth and women movements and platforms in Kano State and 66 for Kaduna State.

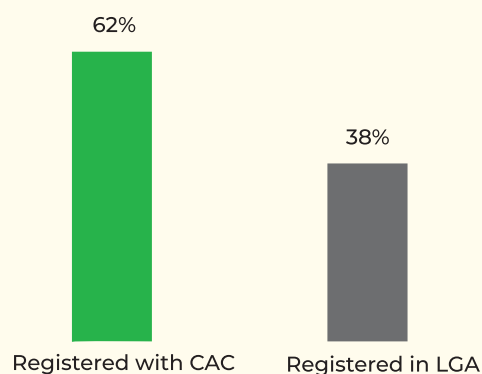
Findings showed that 77% (51 out of 66) of the movements/platforms in Kaduna State are registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) while 62% (16 out of 26) are registered with the CAC in Kano State. On the other hand, 23% of the youths and women movements/platforms are registered within the local government they operate in Kaduna, while 38% are registered within the local government in Kano State.

Figure 2.2: Women and Youth Movements and Platforms in Kano by Registration with CAC



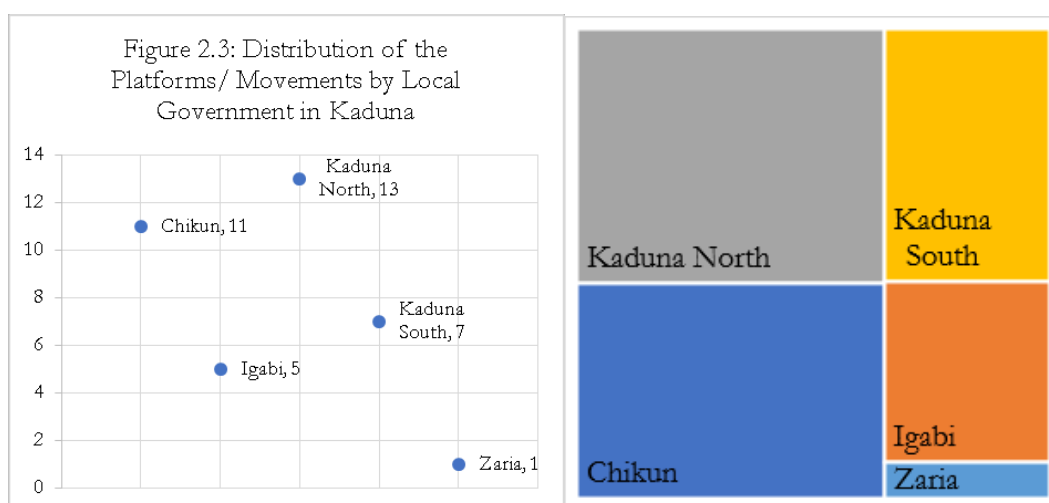

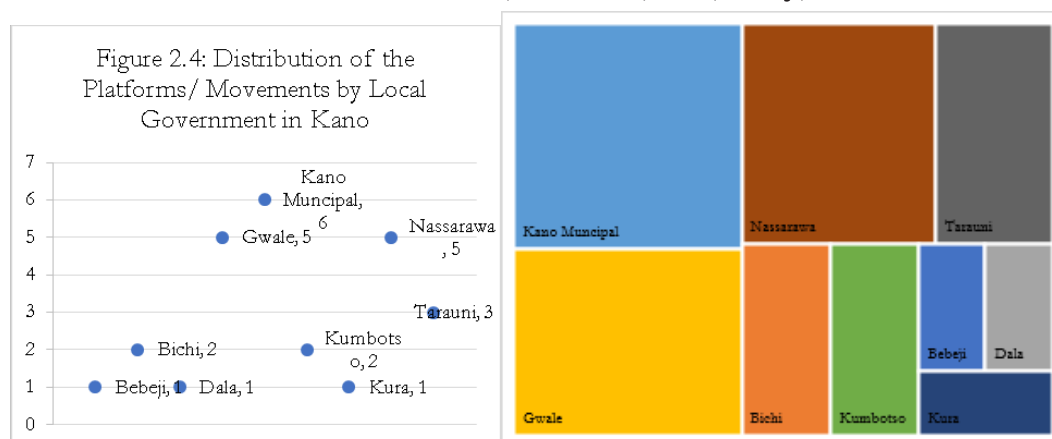
Membership of these movements and platforms range from 10 to 5,000 in Kano State, and from 4 to 8500 in Kaduna. By sectoral classification, 87% of the movements were classified as social in Kaduna State and 95% in Kano State .

The distribution of the Youth movement and platforms in Kaduna shows that Kaduna North had the highest concentration of these movements followed by Chikun LGA. A sizeable number is also found in Southern Kaduna.



The distribution of the Youth movement and platforms in Kano State shows that Kano Municipal had the highest concentration next followed by Nassarawa LGA and Gwale. The other Local Government Areas are Tarauni, Kumbotso, Bichi, Bebeji, Dala and Kura.



There were three Youth movements and platforms in Kaduna State, and one Women platform that operated in all the Local Government Areas of the state, and they are the Federation of Muslim Women Association in Nigeria (FOMWAN), the state chapter of the National Youth Council of Nigeria and the Catholic Youth Organization of Nigeria.

### MAPPING OUT THE KEY WOMEN AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S ACTORS, INFLUENCERS, AND THE POWER DYNAMIC WITHIN THE MAPPED STRUCTURES AND PLATFORMS AT THE STATES

The leadership recruitment process for these platforms and movements is dominantly through appointments, closely followed by elections within the movement/platform. Whereas there is an effective process of transiting leadership from the founder of the movement/ platform to a State lead in Kaduna, it is more common to find movements and platforms that still have their leadership retained by the founder. The transition from one administration to the other is tenured, usually 4 years, and renewable in the second.

Figure 3.1: Youths and Women Movement and Platforms: Leadership Recruitment and Retainment Process in Kaduna

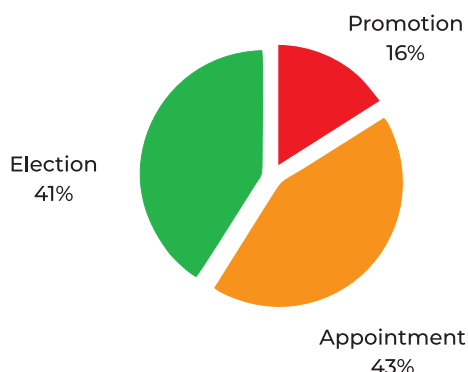
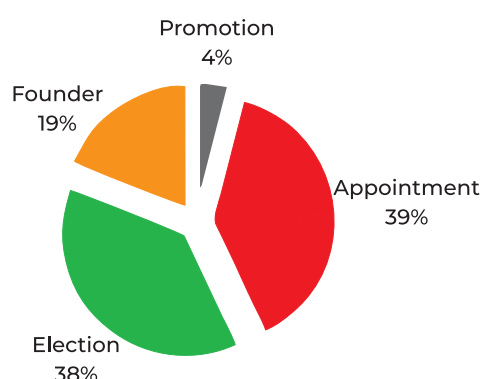


Figure 3.2: Youths and Women Movement and Platforms: Leadership Recruitment and Retainment Process in Kano



#### 3.1 Women and Young People's actors, influencers, and the power dynamic in Kaduna State

To identify the key actors and influencers within these platforms/movements the respondents were asked to identify key persons that could get people in authority to listen to them. These persons were identified in both states. Most of them are persons in government or persons who have gained prominence in the public policy space. Although the use of social media was common with youth and women movements and platforms in Kaduna, it does not play an effective role in changing the political narrative at the grassroots.

## SECTION FOUR:

### LEADERSHIP STRUCTURES, MEMBERSHIP, AND FUNDING PATTERN OF THE MAPPED STRUCTURES AND PLATFORMS OF THE SELECTED GROUPS IN THE STATES

The leadership structure of these movements and platforms in Kano and Kaduna States is that they are founded by an individual or group of persons that registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission or at the local government level where they operate.

Membership is usually by having a common base either as members of the same interest group, religious affiliation, or ideology. Others operate membership by registration. Funding is largely through donations and support from partner organizations to implement programmes/projects.

In Kano, the major source of funding for these movements and platforms are through membership fees/contributions. This is followed by funds received through grants/donations.

Figure 4.2: Funding Structure of Youth and Women Movement and Platforms in Kaduna

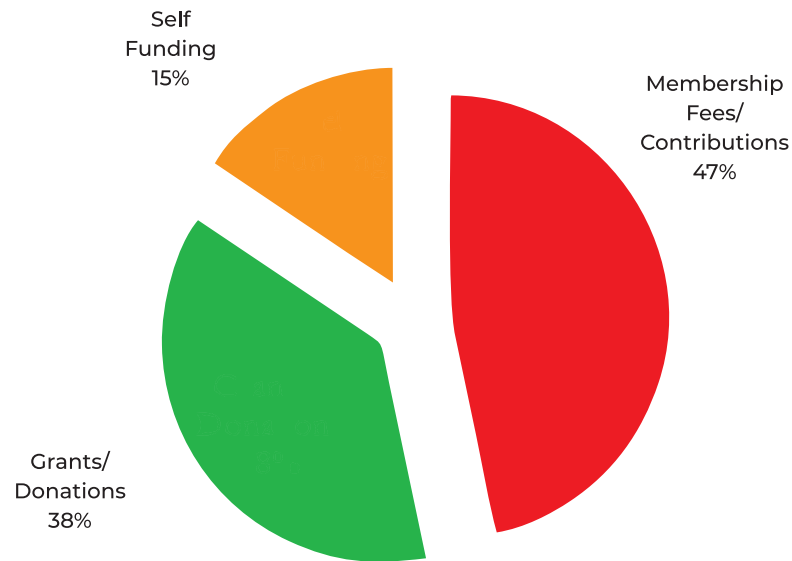

## SECTION FIVE:

### IDENTIFIED STRUCTURES OF YOUTH AND WOMEN MOVEMENT AND PLATFORMS IN KADUNA AND KANO STATES SHOW THAT:

- Young people and women are organized into movements and platforms. Engaging them using these platforms can help scale up their inclusion in the governance space.
- More of these platforms are registered with Corporate Affairs Commission. This is crucial as it communicates that they are compliant with the requirement for legal registration. Whereas a hand full are registered at the Local Government Areas where they operate, they have a wide reach at this level and can sensitize a critical mass of young people and women groups to participate in the political space.
- While the We You Project can partner with these CAC registered platforms and movements, it is important to compel them to work with partners at the grassroots level.
- Funding of the movements and platforms at the Local Government Areas that have been chosen by the project, should be done using those that are registered with the CAC.
- Whereas these groups have persons they label as influential – those who help them to get government to listen or propagate their advocacy, translating messages into local language and identifying radio and traditional media remains critical for mobilization at the local government.
