

#### RESULTS & ACHIEVEMENTS ACROSS INTERVENTION AREAS

15 partners (3 LWROs, 1 LWRO Network, and 12 CBOs) currently demonstrate capacity to implement women's rights and feminist interventions.





#### Addressing Gender-Based Violence/ Violence Against Women and Girls

- Capacities of 2,761 young GBV ambassadors, built and championing GBV prevention and response issues affecting their peers.
- 1 functional resource centre for survivors of GBV, in operation; Ireti Resource Centre managed by WRAHP.
- Contributed towards convictions that were secured of 2 perpetrators for sexual offences.
- Challenged Patriarchy through engagement of 11 Traditional and Community leaders in Alimosho LGA as advocates who now speak up and take actions against GBV.
- 118 vulnerable women and GBV survivors provided economic succour through the provision of palliatives support during COVID 19 Lock down.
- Through sensitization activities by 12 CBOs, 23,135 grassroots women; 12,854 schoolgirls and 8,023 Schoolboys across the 3 Senatorial Districts in Lagos reached with vital information for GBV prevention and response.
- Increased community access to existing GBV laws and policies through simplification and dissemination.



#### Women Economic Justice and Empowerment Programmes

- The Women's Voice and Leadership Nigeria Project in Lagos state has empowered the lives of 931 women and girls through cash assistance, skill acquisition training and start-up grants for business development and expansion.
- Equipped 701 female petty traders with the necessary knowledge needed (Basic Bookkeeping, Customer Service and Stock Control) to access grants. This has led to forty-nine 49 female petty traders accessing grants of N50,000 each from the Federal Government, with another fifty waiting for disbursement from the Lagos State Government. One hundred and twenty are also in process with Sterling Bank Plc.
- Reduction in levies and taxes paid by market women from over N11,000.00 to N6,000 annually in Lagos State.
- Enrolment of fifty 50 selected female petty traders from three markets into the National Health Insurance Scheme.
- Over one million Naira (N1,000,000.00) saved by the women through Village Saving and Loans Associations (VSLA) in Majidun, Ikorodu, Lagos.
- Influenced the inclusion of the informal sector in the reviewed Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) National Policies. This will ensure that microbusinesses, like petty traders, are included in various government plans.



# PROMOTING SOCIO-ECONOMIC INCLUSION OF ELDERLY WOMEN

- Successfully reduced social behaviors of excluding older women in Itedo and Maiyegun communities through strategic sensitization and community advocacy efforts.
- Reduced abuse of older women in Lagos state through comprehensive strategies, including policy dialogues, stakeholder engagements, media partnerships, and impactful online campaigns.
- Achieved a remarkable transformation in the well-being of nearly nearly older women in two
  communities, through learning and sharing within the monthly wellbeing parties.
- Established Pioneering Safe Spaces for older women. The Senior Women Association (SEWA) was founded in project communities.
- Successfully amplified older women's voices on pertinent issues through engaging in participatory filmmaking and active involvement in policy advocacy.



### **USE OF RADIO AS A TOOL FOR DEVELOPMENT**

- Through 834 Hervoice productions of 138 radio episodes, 480 radio jingle spots, 78, audio-visuals, 120 IEC materials, HerVoice increased women education on issues of gender-based violence and connected women to help centres. Male Listeners also got involved on the ills of GBV on women and girls. Increasing the emergence of male champions with our Men's Conversations.
- Used Radio to influence the increased visibility of WVL-N projects on social media platforms with over 372,400 engagements.
- Enhanced partnership with WVL partners on different platforms and live coverage of protest to lobby for the demands of the Nigerian women for the passage of the 5-gender bill.
- Supported and gave visibility to female political candidates ahead of the 2023 elections that resulted to Rukaiyat Shittu the youngest lawmaker emerging winner in Kwara State.
